Significant Points 2005:

- Members cannot join BAI directly, only through a club.
- A blokart club pack detailing formation of a club, types of events to hold, weight divisions, racing and equipment rules was prepared and available for potential clubs to use.
- The inaugural NZ Open was held at Blokart Heaven, Papamoa 24-30 October 2005 with 86 competitors. Racing Thursday to Saturday with Sunday a reserve day. Light winds created some creative sailing – a train of 20+ blokarts joined together and sailed the track. Mr Blokart, Paul Beckett, decided a nearby tree was blocking the light wind and demolished it with a chainsaw.

Significant Points 2006:

- 2006 NZ Open was held at Blokart Heaven, Papamoa with 70 competitors including 8 from Australia, 3 from USA, and 5 from Japan. A professional video of the event was filmed and 100 DVDs distributed.
- Initial discussions regarding the formation of an international blokart association were held and the International Blokart Racing Association was formed with Grant Crawshay elected Chair.
- Discussion around ABC hosting the inaugural world championships at Bruce Pulman Park, Auckland in October 2007, but as that venue will have construction work happening, the event will be moved to Blokart Heaven in Papamoa during October 2008.

Significant Points 2007:

- Inaugural NZ Masters Games were held at Wanganui in February 2007. Venue was a small carpark with overhanging trees, so moved onto the grass of a cricket pitch.
- International equipment and racing rules agreed by IBRA were used for the first time at the 2007 Australian Open.
- A keen group of blokart sailors from Bay Blokart Club sailed across the Mongolian Desert.
- Preparations for a Youth Championships were under way.
- 2007 NZ Open was held at Blokart Heaven, Papamoa with 53 competitors.
- ChipX transponders acquired and were put in waterproof, floatable canisters.
- Proposed that there be 8 knots minimum wind for races to be run, but that was later rescinded.
- Much discussion about the new 5.5 metre sails:
 - They not be permitted for the 2007 NZ Open – only to be used for fun races
 - Wind limits and weight divisions for the use of 5.5m sails
 - Can they be used in Production – if so, what mast sections?

- Only super heavies can use them
- These issues were eventually resolved – use them any time but no carbon mast sections for Production class.

- The inaugural Blokart World Championships were held at Blokart Heaven in Papamoa in October 2008 with 94 competitors from 9 countries.

 - Gabe Young BBC – Lightweight
 - Haydn Ingall ABC – Middleweight
 - Russell Harray ABC – Heavyweight
 - Dave (Orca) Bush ABC – Superweight
- 2008 Secondary Schools Champs were cancelled due to lack of support from students.
- 2009 NZ Masters Games was held at Ohakea Airbase.
- Proposed that a North Island Champs be held in order to access Ohakea.
- Canterbury Blokart Club was formed and became a member of NZBAI.
- Jiglu was used as a forum for blokart sailors to communicate news and views.

Significant Points 2014:

- 2014 Blokart World Championships were held at Lake Walyungup, Perth, Australia In January
- New Zealand world champions were (Performance Class unless stated):
 - Haydn Ingall ABC – Middleweight
 - Theo Vondervoort BBC – Superweight
- Protest fees will be refunded to a competitor whose protest is successful.
- NZBAI dress shirts were available for members to purchase
- Masters Games format to change to age-based with 5-year age bands (bands to be merged where insufficient numbers) to have more alignment with the MG organisation.
- 2014 NZ Open was held at Wigram
- Event planning, management, and responsibilities document was introduced – Major Events Guidelines
- Clubs were surveyed regarding major events – agreed policy:
 - Production and performance classes to be offered at national events, and Cruiser be offered at NIO and SIO but not at NZO
 - Divisions to be combined within a class where there are few entrants – sliding scale introduced
 - Where practicable classes are to be run separately, not concurrently. This was amended July 2015 to permit classes to sail concurrently where there are fewer than 8 entrants in a class.
 - Cruiser class to be run separately from other classes – where practicable. No minimum numbers for cruiser. Name is “Cruiser Class”, not “C”
 - Dual entries (production and performance) are permitted

Significant Points 2015:

- Clubs were surveyed in 2014 as to the purpose of NZBAI and what they want from NZBAI – 10 key points were adopted as NZBAI’s purpose – it’s reason for existence.
- A national (generic) NZBAI brochure was produced and 100 copies given to each club
- Quarterly NZBAI newsletters commenced
- 2015 NZ Open was held at Blokart Heaven, Papamoa
- AGMs can now be held up until 30 November each year, preferably in conjunction with the NIO, SIO, or NZO.
- NZBAI Facebook group was set up
- Major Events Guidelines document was reviewed and updated following 12 month’s trial

Significant Points 2016:

- Modified Flexible Weight Bands were adopted for the NIO and SIO, and Sliding Scale Fixed Weight bands were adopted for the NZO.
- 2016 Blokart World Championships were held at Ivanpah, USA
- New Zealand world champions were (Performance Class unless stated):
 - Michael Denton CYBC – Heavyweight Production
 - David Heilbron ABC – Lightweight
 - Alex Morris CYBC – Middleweight
 - Wayne Osborne ABC – Superweight
- 300 NZBAI / Club business cards were provided to each club
- A record of results and place-getters for all NZBAI events since 2005 was compiled
- NZBAI purchased 10 licences for MyLaps timing software and will donate two to each club on application
- If there are less than six entrants in Cruiser class, entrants would be offered the opportunity to either move to another Class or have their entry fees refunded.
- 2016 NZ Open was held at Ardmore
- NZO to be held in the South Island every third year
- National safety guidelines and templates were agreed
- Further discussion on wheeling and halting races, but no practical solution found (again)
- Payment to clubs for providing timing at NZ events be \$250 per day and that the current \$200 set-up fee be dropped following the NZBAI assistance to clubs for new timing software.
- Payment to clubs for providing facilities (eg tents, buildings) should be on the basis of the host club itemising facilities to be provided, with a proposed cost for the budget. NZBAI events sub-committee to review the costings.

Significant Points 2017:

- Support was given to MBC's proposal that NZBAI host the 2020 world championships at Ohakea and Sanson.
- IBRA affirmed that production class should be kept a pure entry level class with fibreglass mast sections, standard downhulls etc, as present. Otherwise production and performance classes will end up converging.
- National events should be for at least two days, as one day does not justify the travel for many.
- Further submissions and discussions on wheeling and halting races, but no practical solution (again)
- 2017 NZ Open was held at Wigram
- Decided to trial having the formal dinners for national events on the night of the last day of racing to encourage attendance and unwind/celebrate the event

- 2020 NZ Open was held at Wigram, Christchurch in February
- Only one cup will be taken to each national event to be used for a photograph of each winner. Place-getters will receive a trophy or medal. Relevant cups will still be engraved with winners' names and the cups will be displayed if/when a suitable site becomes available.
- Decided not to join the NZ Masters Games but to hold a blokart age-based event at Manawatu every second year.
- The COVID-19 pandemic forced the cancellation of the 2020 North Island Open at Napier and the postponement of the 2020 Blokart World Championship event for a year.
